James L. Wescoat, Jr. is an Aga Khan Professor of Islamic Architecture at MIT, where he co-directs MIT's Leventhal Center for Advanced Urbanism. His research concentrates on water systems in South Asia and the US from the site to district, state, and river basin scales. Professor Wescoat has conducted water policy research in the Colorado, Indus, Ganges, and Great Lakes basins. He led a USEPA-funded study of potential climate impacts in the Indus River Basin with the Water and Power Development Authority (WAPDA), and contributed to a World Bank study of climate impacts and adaptation in the Indus. His books include *Water for Life: Water Management and Environmental Policy* and *Political Economies of Landscape Changes: Places of Integrative Power*. He is currently conducting research projects on drinking water planning with the Government of Maharashtra and World Bank, and retrofitting canal irrigation systems with small hydro and solar energy units.
