## **Journals/Newsletters and Publications of ITPI**

### **ETHICS POLICY FOR ITPI JOURNALS**

1. Authorship of ITPI Journals is limited to those who have made a significant contribution to the conception, design, execution, research or interpretation on the theme of Article.
2. Plagiarism is considered an academic misconduct by the ITPI Journal. Some examples of plagiarism including copying verbatim or using another author's ideas should give proper credit to the authors for using their material. The authors therefore are advised not to indulge in:
  - Quoting verbatim of another author's work without proper citation of the source in the text and in the list of references;
  - Paraphrasing another person's work by changing some of words, or the order of words without due citation of the source;
  - Using ideas taken from someone else without reference to the original author;
  - Cutting and pasting from the Internet is clearly regarded plagiarism;
  - Submitting someone else's work as part of author's own without identifying clearly who did the work.
  - Sources should be properly acknowledged in the format mentioned in the Guidelines prescribed for the authors.
3. Self-plagiarism is also considered academic misconduct by the ITPI Journal. Self-plagiarism refers to the practice of an author using portions of his previous writings on the same topic in another article without specifically citing the self-plagiarized material.
4. An author should not in general publish manuscripts describing essentially the same research in more than one journal or primary publication. ITPI does not view the following uses of a work as prior publication i.e. publication in the form of an abstract; publication as an academic thesis; publication as an electronic preprint; etc.
5. All submissions must include disclosure of all relationships that could be viewed as presenting a potential conflict of interest.
6. When an author discovers a significant error or inaccuracy in his/her own published work, it is the author's obligation to promptly notify to the editor of the journal or publisher and cooperate with the editor to retract or correct the article.
7. Authors of reports of original research should present an accurate account of the work performed as well as an objective discussion of its significance.
